CLONTARF FORUM

Workers Lifestyle Group was delighted to host Clontarf Foundation's Sydney Employment Forum in our Diamond showroom. Clontarf operates campuses at more than 150 host schools around Australia that are open to any Indigenous boys enrolled, to develop values and abilities around education, leadership, employment, life skills and sports.

The aim of the forum is to connect employers with Indigenous students. Employers from 25 companies met around 100 impressive final year students from eight Sydney region Clontarf Academies and saw first-hand the success of a unique program developing Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander boys into young men.

It was great to see the energy and enthusiasm from both the employers and young men who each reported the value of the day. Since Clontarf Foundation began in 2000 in Perth, more than 6,815 young men have graduated from high school into employment.

Alumni remain in the Clontarf family, guiding and supporting current academy boys and programs, while they also are supported by Clontarf employment officers.

Some 11,400 boys are in Clontarf programs this year, including 1,000 Year 12s, supported by 580 staff.

Of the 46 young men who graduated from Clontarf's Sydney region academies last year, 25 have full-time jobs, 10 started apprenticeships or traineeships and five are at universities. This year, 100 boys in Years 10-12 are already working part-time.

Five academies are located at schools around Mt Druitt and Workers Blacktown is a long-term supporter of Clontarf's work and a Sydney Employment Forum partner.

CAMP QUALITY

Workers Lifestyle Group was pleased to be given the opportunity to make a contribution to an extremely worthy cause. Two amazing men, Ed Orszulak and Seb Boehm, were able to visit the Club whilst walking from Brisbane to Melbourne in 35 days to raise money for Camp Quality. The 2 walkers, accompanied by our local member Stephen Bali MLA and well wishers made a pit stop at Workers Blacktown to receive our contribution of \$5000 and some of our hospitality.

Camp Quality is a charity which brings positivity, fun and laughter back into the lives of kids impacted by cancer through providing camps and family experiences.

The services and programs help families build optimism and resilience through community, education and fun. Camp Quality provides support for kids (0-15 years) dealing with their own cancer diagnosis, or the diagnosis of a sibling or parent, every step of the way. The programs provide hospital support, age-appropriate education, camps, fun days and family retreats that provide families with a break from cancer to reconnect and build a supportive community

It was good to see so many people including the Wolkara Elders join in to get fit, have fun and compete on the day.

One of the new recipients for ClubGRANTS is a marvellous organisation, Love for Australia.

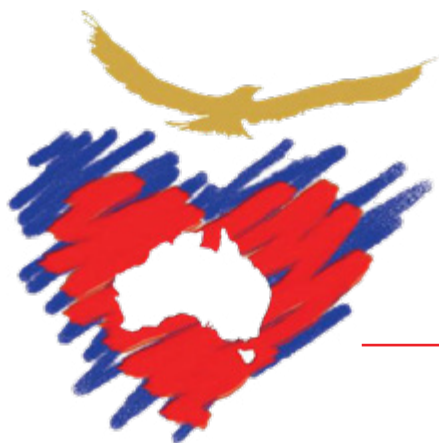
This family run organisation, aims to provide a friendly helping hand to those in a temporary financial crisis by offering essential items through a FREE grocery store in Seven Hills.

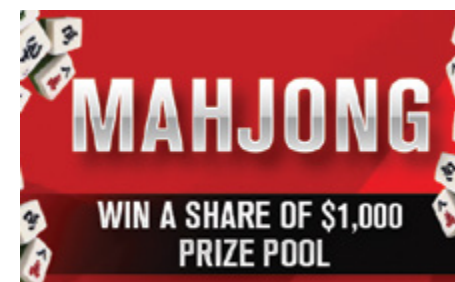

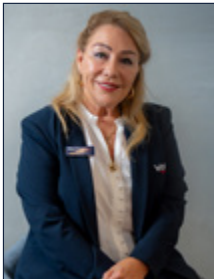
